Block 2: "Things are Made"



Cut the following:

Blizzard Shimmer— (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF cuts \Rightarrow Subcut into (2) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $38 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle

(2) 26" x WOF Subcut into (2) 26" x 30" rectangles; use remainder to cut (18) 3" squares for the flying geese

Apple Shimmer— (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" rectangle

Mandarin Shimmer- (1) 5 ½" x 3" rectangle see Applique templates for Block 2 Sunset Spectrastatic- see Applique templates for Block 2

Marigold Spectrastatic— (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" rectangle see Applique templates for Block 2 Star Shimmer— see Applique templates for Block 2

Citron Shimmer– (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" rectangle see Applique templates for Block 2 Wasabi Shimmer– (1) $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" rectangle see Applique templates for Block 2

Caribbean Shimmer- (1) 5 ½" x 3" rectangle

Peacock Shimmer- (1) 5 ½" x 3" rectangle see Applique templates for Block 2

Dawn Shimmer- (1) 5 ½ X 3 rectangle

Block 2: "Things are Made"

Flying Geese Instructions:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line in pencil or Frixion pen on each of your 3 ½" Blizzard Shimmer squares from one corner to the opposite corner.
- 2. Line up one of your 3" Blizzard Shimmer squares with one side of your 5 ½" x 3" rectangle, right sides of the fabric together. Pin in place if necessary.
- 3. Sew down the diagonal line. Press seam open and trim off excess (see my video for reducing waste with this flying geese method).
- 4. Repeat steps 2 & 3 for the other side of the 5 ½" x 3" rectangle, ensuring your drawn diagonal lines create a "v".
- 5. Repeat steps 2 through 4 for the remaining 5 ½" x 3" rectangles of each color.

Alternately, you can use whatever method you'd like for a 5" x 2 ½" finished flying geese block.

- 6. Sew completed flying geese units together with a ¼" seam in color order: Apple Shimmer, Mandarin Shimmer, Marigold Spectrastatic, Citron Shimmer, Wasabi Shimmer, Caribbean Shimmer, Peacock Shimmer, Dawn Shimmer, Violet Shimmer.
- 7. Attach your 5 ½" x 2 ½" Blizzard Shimmer rectangle with a ¼" seam to the top of the column of flying geese. Your column should now measure 5 ½" x 25."

Assembly Instructions:

- 1. Sew the (2) 26" x 30" Blizzard Shimmer pieces together with a ¼" seam on the 26" widths—it will measure approximately 25 ¾" x 59 ¾". This will form the background for your applique, and you'll be trimming it down/squaring it up before sewing anything else to it. ***Also note that some of the applique pieces will be adhered after sewing to Blocks 1 & 6, but you'll want to complete most of the applique at this stage because of the difficulty of maneuvering a large piece of fabric through the neck of your sewing machine. The applique pieces that will be adhered after you attach Block 2 to Blocks 1 & 6 are noted both on the applique templates and layout guides.
- 2. Press your seam on the 25 ¾" x 59 ¾ block." Follow basic applique instructions (on page 1) using reversed applique templates (taking care to save those pieces that you'll adhere after sewing Block 1 to Block 2).
- 3. Trim your applique block down to 25" x 57 ½" (you may want to fold the block on the seam to ensure the block is square).
- 4. Sew your column of flying geese to the right hand side of your applique block with a ½" seam.
- 5. Attach your finished Block 1 to Block 2 with a ¼" seam.
- 6. Adhere and stitch the applique pieces that needed to be attached after Block 1 was added (noted on the applique templates and layout guides).
- 7. Pin and attach your (2) 5 ½" x 38 ½" sashings (Blizzard Shimmer) to the left and right hand sides of your quilt top with ¼" seams.
